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JCIH 1-3-6 GOALS

The Guam EHDI Project promotes the following Joint Committee on Infant Hearing (JCIH) guidelines (known as the "1-3-6" Plan"):



SCAN ME

- All babies born on Guam are screened for hearing loss by 1 month of age;
- Babies are diagnosed with a hearing loss by 3 months of age;
- Babies are enrolled in quality early intervention services by 6 months of age.

EARLY IDENTIFICATION OF HEARING LOSS IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE:

Hearing loss is the most frequent birth defect.

Undetected hearing loss has serious negative consequences.

There are dramatic benefits associated with early identification of hearing loss.

Hearing Screening Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Why screen a baby's hearing?

- Hearing, language, and communication skills are developed at birth
- Parents often think they would know if their baby cannot hear, but that is not the case
- Screening with specialized equipment is important

Parent is not deaf or hard of hearing, so why would you screen their baby?

- Most babies who are deaf or hard of hearing are born to parents that can hear which is why all babies are screened at birth

How do you check a baby's hearing?

- The **Otoacoustic Emissions** (OAE) measures sound waves produced in the inner ear. A tiny probe is placed just inside the baby's ear canal. It measures the response (echo) when clicks or tones are played into the baby's ears.
- The **Automated Auditory Brainstem Response** (AABR) measures how the hearing nerve and brain respond to sound. Clicks or tones are played through soft earphones into the baby's ears. Three electrodes placed on the baby's head, arm, and back of the neck measure the hearing nerve and brain response.
- A baby may be screened with one or both methods. Screenings are safe, quick, and painless.
- Results are available as soon as the screening is complete

Pass Result for Babies at High Risk

- Babies that are in the neonatal intensive care unit and/or specialty care unit or have certain birth conditions are at greater risk for changes in their hearing over time.
- Routine testing of the baby's hearing is recommended with a pediatric audiologist who specializes in testing infants and young children.
- Guam EHDl will contact parent(s) within four to five months of age to schedule a hearing screening appointment

Did Not Pass Before Discharge or Incomplete Screening

- Further testing is needed
- Parents are referred to Guam EHDl by setting an appointment and asking them to complete the universal referral form and a map to their residence

Emergency Preparedness



Prepare, Plan, and Pack

Emergency situations can happen at any time, and at any place. Whether natural or man-made, these emergency situations can result in damage to property and endanger the health and safety of the general public.

Guam regularly experiences natural disasters such as typhoons, earthquakes, and floods. Fires and disasters from hazardous materials are other occurrences that may endanger you and your property.

Prepare Basic Supplies

In the event of an emergency, you should be prepared to be self-sufficient for up to seven days. Preparing and maintaining an emergency supply of essential items can help ensure that you have adequate supplies to meet your and your family's needs until help arrives.

Basic emergency supplies include:

- One week supply of canned and dried food items
- Drinking water – at least one gallon per person per day
- Flashlights and extra batteries
- Battery operated radio
- First Aid kit
- Whistle
- 10 - 30 day supply of medications and medical supplies
- Toilet tissue and personal hygiene supplies
- Water for flushing toilet in the event water is shut off
- Trash bags, gloves, duct tape or masking tape, and plastic containers for storing items
- Chlorine bleach for sanitizing
- Propane stove and extra propane gas
- Cell Phone with charger, extra battery
- Can Opener
- Roll up mat and blankets
- 3-day supply of change of clothes
- Sturdy shoes
- Lighter
- Formula (powder or liquid)
- Baby food
- Disposable diapers
- Change of clothes, bibs, blankets
- Baby soap, shampoo, powder, lotion and wipes
- Disposable gloves/Hand sanitizer
- Favorite toy, blanket, stuffed animal or books
- Paper products (plates, spoons, forks, and paper towels)

Emergency Preparedness

Make a Plan and Practice your Plan

Emergency preparedness also means making a plan.

Your plan should:

- Designate a place to meet if you and your family are separated from each other.
- Pick a primary and alternate contact number for you and your family to call if you are separated from each other.
- Establish a buddy system with other family members, friends, neighbors, or co-workers, and develop a plan on how you can help each other.
- Consider including your children in your planning, preparation, and other activities to help them understand the importance of emergency preparedness. Children learn from your example.
- Share your plan and your emergency contact list with members in your buddy system.
- Make a plan on how to secure your house in case you are not home or you are otherwise unable to secure your home.
- Identify another place to go to in case you need to evacuate.
- Establish your primary and alternate evacuation routes.
- If you use mobility aids, plan on how to take them with you and how to store extra aids at your alternate shelter, if possible.

Pack a GO-KIT (Disaster Supply Kit)

You should prepare a bag with your most essential items that you can grab if an emergency situation occurs and you need to evacuate right away. Be sure the bag is not too heavy for you or someone to carry.

Your emergency GO-KIT should include:

- List of contact numbers
- Dried foods and bottled water
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Whistle
- Small portable radio and extra batteries
- Basic toiletries and sanitary items
- Medications and medical supplies
- Important documents, including medical information

It is a good idea to:

- Place your bag near an entry or exit way so it can easily be carried out.
- Put reminder notices in your calendar or appointment book to check and replace items in your bag at least every 6 months.
- Let people in your buddy system know where your GO-KIT is located.

What if my baby did not pass the hearing screening?

My baby did not pass the hearing screening, what do I do next?

Please don't panic. Not passing the hearing screening does not mean that your baby is deaf or hard-of-hearing. But we won't know for sure without further testing. So your baby needs a Diagnostic Audiological Evaluation (DAE).

The DAE is performed by an audiologist, who is a special doctor trained to diagnose and manage hearing loss in infants, children, and adults.

Don't miss the DAE appointment. Only the DAE can determine the presence or absence of hearing loss. Early diagnosis and treatment of hearing loss will help your baby's speech, communication, and learning.

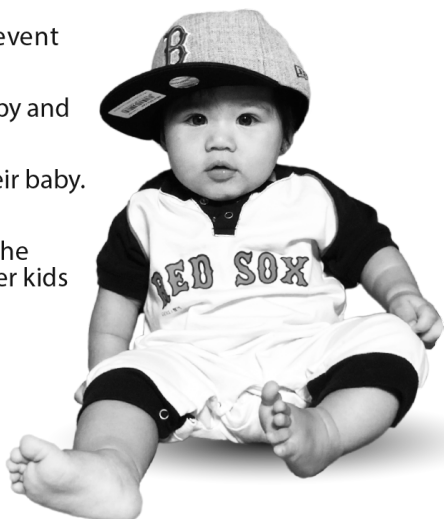
What to expect before your appointment...

- Guam Early Intervention System (GEIS) will contact you. GEIS will assist you in scheduling an appointment for your baby with the audiologist.
- If you have medical insurance, you will need a referral from your Primary Care Physician (PCP) or Pediatrician to see the audiologist. GEIS will help you figure this out, too.

How to prepare for the appointment...

For the DAE we want your baby to come to the appointment tired and hungry. Feeding a hungry and tired baby right before the test would help your baby sleep through the test.

- Don't feed your baby 2 hours before the appointment time.
- Keep your baby **awake** 2 hours before the appointment. Try not to let your baby sleep on the car ride to the appointment.
- Bring a bottle or pacifier for your baby in the event he/she awakes before or during the DAE.
- Bring anything you need to keep your baby happy and asleep once you get to the appointment.
- Breastfeeding mothers are welcome to nurse their baby. We will have a private room for you.
- It's best if you do not bring other children to the appointment. You will be too busy to watch other kids and the room must be quiet during testing.



How long is the appointment?

The appointment can take 1 – 2 hours.

How is the DAE done?

The audiologist will perform some or all of these tests. These tests are harmless. They don't hurt. In fact, most babies sleep throughout the entire test procedure.

- **Otoscopy** – The audiologist will look into your baby's ear with an otoscope or special ear light to look for ear wax, infection, or debris.
- **Auditory Brainstem Response (ABR)** - THE ABR will record your baby's brain activity to different sounds. Three electrodes will be placed on your baby's head and insert earphones will be placed in each ear. The electrodes record brain activity and the earphones deliver clicks and sound to each ear separately. The ABR will provide information on which sounds your baby can hear. This test is done for babies 0 to 6 months of age.
- **Diagnostic Otoacoustic Emission (OAE)** – A probe microphone is placed in your baby's ear. This probe mic will send sounds and record echoes from the inner ear. The echo recordings can give us information on high-frequency hearing.
- **Tympanometry** - This test is used to check your baby's middle ear. A small probe is placed in the ear canal and delivers positive and negative pressure. The pressure change will measure how well the eardrum moves and if the bones and muscles in the middle-ear work. This test can help identify if there is an ear infection.



DAE is done, what's next?

- The audiologist will provide a report for you, Guam Early Intervention System (GEIS), and your baby's doctor.
- Additional follow-up appointments with the audiologist and/or Ear, Throat, Nose (ENT) doctor may be necessary based on the results.
- If hearing loss is identified, hearing aid consultation, selection and fitting process will be coordinated by GEIS and the audiologist.

Tips for Families

- Parenting is the biggest challenge you will face. It is okay to ask for help when you need it.

- Children never outgrow their need to be touched gently and often – it helps them feel secure and calm so they continue to learn and grow.
- Provide a variety of sensory experiences – taste, touch, smell, sight, sound – to help build your baby's brain.
- It is never too early to introduce books to your baby.
- Play is how young children learn best.
- Children learn from your example.



What is the Hearing Screening Process?

1

Initial Hearing Screening

A hearing screener will test the baby's ear by placing a tiny microphone in each ear that play sounds. This checks how a baby's ear and brain responds to sound.

2

Outpatient Hearing Screening

If a baby does not pass the Initial Hearing Screening. A second screening is done by placing ear cups on both ears, and sensors on the baby's forehead, shoulder, and back of the neck. This checks how the baby's brain responds to sounds.

3

Diagnostic Audiological Evaluation

If a baby does not pass the Outpatient Hearing Screening. This test is done by an audiologist who can determine if there is a hearing loss.

- ✓ Understands "no" or "bye bye"
- ✓ Begins to turn head toward soft sounds
- ✓ Looks at familiar objects when named

12-18 MONTHS

- ✓ Readily turns toward all sound
- ✓ Recognizes name and understands about 50 words
- ✓ Moves from saying 2 words to 10 words
- ✓ Follows simple directions ("find your ball")

18-24 MONTHS

- ✓ Enjoys being read to
- ✓ Points to body parts when asked
- ✓ Starts to combine words, such as "more milk"

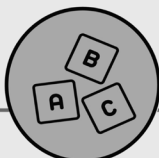

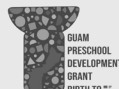

Key Steps for Early Identification

Monitoring, screening, evaluating, and diagnosing children as early as possible are important steps to making sure that children receive the services and supports they need to reach their full potential.



PARENT-ENGAGED DEVELOPMENTAL MONITORING

- Developmental monitoring helps parents see or watch how their children play, learn, speak, behave, and move like other children their age.
- If your child is not meeting milestones or you have concerns, ask their doctor for a developmental screening.
- Use the “Learn The Signs, Act Early,” Developmental Checklists or the Milestones Tracker App to track your child’s development and learn which milestones to look for.

- Tell your child’s doctor or nurse that your child is not meeting milestones and that you have concerns and ask for a developmental screening for your child. You can even bring your completed developmental checklist with you to the appointment.

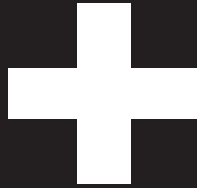

- You will be contacted about what services your child needs and other supports that are available for your child and family.
- The key is to learn about what your child needs and make sure they get the supports and services to help them grow happy, healthy, and safe.
- Some support services may include home visits, physical therapy, speech therapy, occupational therapy, vision services, hearing services, assistive technology, and more.

Health Services

Tips for Families

- Eat foods that are good for you – vegetables, fruits, grains, and dairy foods.
- Get daily exercise – walk with your baby, play outside with your toddler or preschooler.
- NEVER shake your baby! Don't throw your baby, even if you are playing, as this may cause the brain to swell, bleed, or bruise which can cause blindness, seizures, intellectual disability, other disabilities, or even death.
- Arrange for your child to receive regular check-ups and scheduled immunizations.
- If you call your doctor's office/clinic, be sure to get the name of the person you speak with in case you need to call back or if questions come up.
- Ask the clinic if they accept walk-ins and if there are any payments to be made up front.
- Be sure to verify the type of insurance (including Medicaid), the doctor/clinic will accept.
- Ask what types of payment are accepted – cash, check, and/or credit card.
- Make sure you have the necessary documents to help get the most out of your child's visit – shot records, medical history, medications (type and dosage), insurance, guardianship, etc.

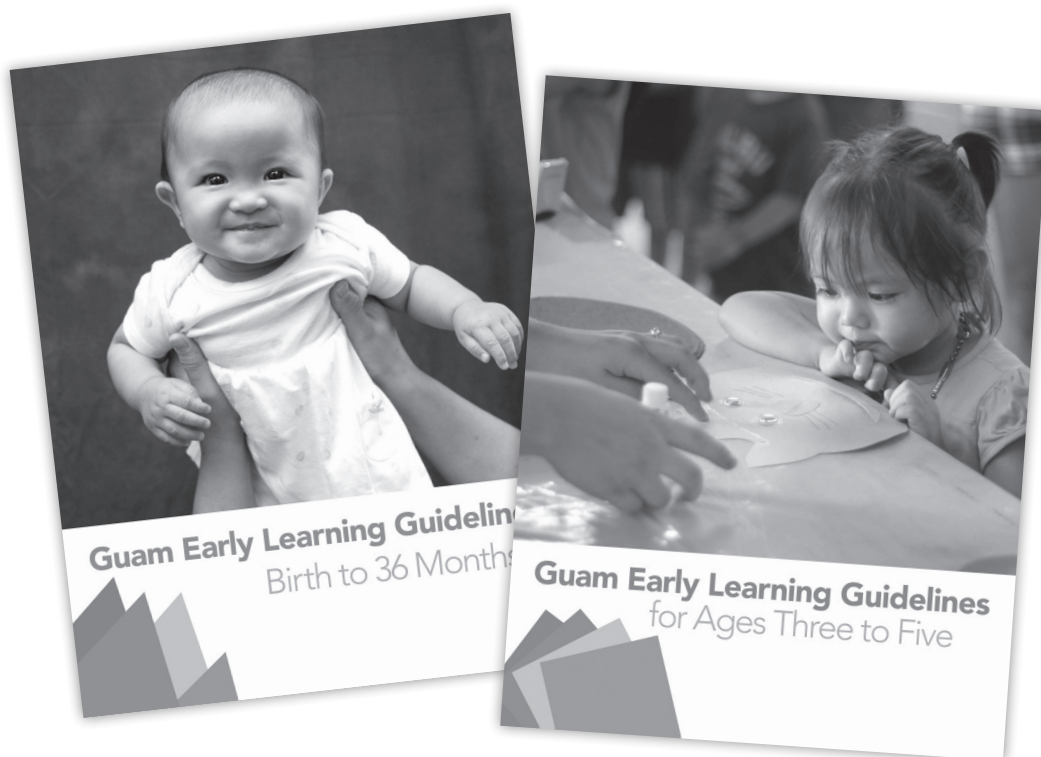

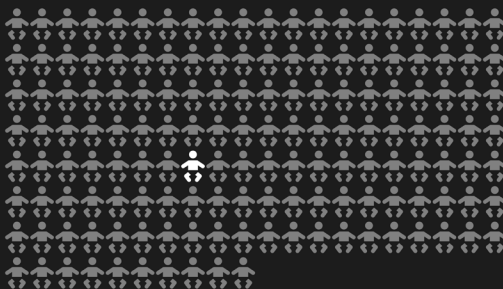

A CRITICAL LOOK AT CYTOMEGALOVIRUS

When a baby is born with CMV infection, it is called congenital CMV infection. It can be transmitted through bodily fluids and/or vertical transmission (in utero, during the birthing process).

About 1 out of every 150 babies are born with congenital CMV infection. Once infected, it stays in your body for the rest of your life.



About 1 in 5 babies with congenital CMV infection will have long-term health problems such as hearing loss, vision loss, small head size lack of coordination in rare cases, death.



In the United States, 1 in 3 children have already been infected with CMV by age 5.
